


A Minute with ... The Master

Dear All,

When I took office as Master of the Guild of Young Freemen in May 2020, talk was very much of 'return to normal' by Autumn. How wrong I was! However, after 15 months of Zoom and "you're on mute", I am delighted to direct your attention to some wonderful events over the next few months including the Sheep Drive in September, Lord Mayor's Show in November and our Annual Banquet - postponed three times over the past year but fourth time's the charm - in October!


Spotlight on the City

Each newsletter will spotlight a Livery Company, Guild, Ward Club or other institution connected with the City of London.

The Guild of Mercers' Scholars

The Guild of Mercers' Scholars is a voluntarily run Guild in the City of London, made up of alumni and associates of the Mercers' Company's cluster of schools. Amongst its principal objectives is enabling its members to become Liverymen of City Companies.

By engaging with pupils and former pupils of the Mercers' Cluster of schools, the Guild of Mercers' Scholars aims to demonstrate and promote helpful reciprocal communication,



outreach and recognition with the Worshipful Company of Mercers and amongst all members and partners.

"To encourage former pupils of Mercers' Foundation and Associated Schools and others to become Freemen and Liverymen"

The Guild of Mercers' Scholars is the oldest organisation of its type and one of only two in the City of London; its origins date to an early lunch meeting in June 1947 of Liverymen of City of London Companies who all had in common that they had attended Mercers' School. This luncheon was held at Tallow Chandlers' Hall by courtesy of Old Mercer Major Stanley W Wells MBE who was Master of that Company. The Old Mercer Liverymen were joined by the Headmaster of Mercers' School and the Master and Wardens of the Mercers' Company.

With the closing of Mercers' School in 1959 it was decided, in order to protect the long-term future of the Guild, to invite membership from former pupils from other schools in the Mercers' Cluster, a policy that has had considerable success, with many former pupils of those schools having now passed through the Master's chair. Today the Guild has over 200 members, plus over 40 Apprentices working towards Freedom of the City and full membership of the Guild.
